

# P.E. AND SPORT PREMIUM BUDGET 2018 – 2019

**Grant allocation: £18,980**

The Government has given sport premium funding for schools to use to show additional and sustainable improvements in the following five areas:

1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – kick-starting healthy, active lifestyles
2. The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
3. Increase confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
5. Increased participation in competitive sport

The following budget has been planned to enable our school to make improvements in the areas above as well as into improving the learning environments used for PE school sport and physical activity. All allocations are subject to change and will be updated throughout the year.
